

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are really pleased to be able to share the outcome of our recent Ofsted visit in February.

The inspectors judged West Wycombe School to be meeting the ‘*expected standard*’ across all key areas, including achievement, the curriculum, early years, inclusion, leadership, and pupils’ personal development. Importantly, they also confirmed that safeguarding is effective, with a strong and positive culture across the school.

For those of you who have been part of our journey over time, you will know that the school has faced a number of challenging Ofsted outcomes since 2016. This makes this report a particularly important milestone for the school. It reflects just how much progress has been made, with inspectors recognising the “significant change” that has taken place since the last inspection.

What we are most proud of is how the report captures the feel of the school and the experience of the children. Inspectors spoke about pupils being proud of their school, the calm and kind atmosphere, and the strong relationships between staff and children. They also highlighted that children achieve well, feel valued, and are well prepared for the next stage of their education.

There is one area identified for further development, which focuses on continuing to improve attendance so that it is at least in line with national figures for all groups of pupils. This is already a priority for us, and we will continue to work closely with families to support this.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you. Your support, encouragement and partnership with the school have played an important part in this journey. We are also incredibly proud of our staff team, whose care, commitment and high expectations for every child shine through in this report every day.

At West Wycombe, we remain completely focused on providing the very best for your children. We are excited about the future and will continue to build on this progress—developing the curriculum further, strengthening opportunities such as Forest School, and ensuring every child thrives both academically and personally.
